### 1.1 INTRODUCTION

Govt. Naveen College Pali, Korba C.G. came into existence in the year 13th June 2013 in the Pali, Korba. The college started with arts, commerce and science faculty in Government Higher Secondary School Pali near Samudaik Bhawan Pali District Korba, C.G. In 2013,the first principal of our college was Dr. A.K. Tripathi. The college building with its owncampus was established on 1st January 2017. The collegecampus is spread over 05 acres of area. Which is surrounded with beautiful nature. Government college, Pali is a big PG college located in Pali Tahsil, District Korba. It is 50km away from BilaspurDistrict, (C.G.) and 55km away from District Korba C.G. The college being located in the tribal area, it creates educational accessibility for tribal students to pursue courses in the college.

The total strength of students is 498 in the current year 2019-20. At present, there are three faculty in the college, arts, commerce and science. There is post-Graduation in two subject's commerce and sociology and only UG in science faculty. All the teaching posts are filled by regular teachers. We aim to retain our prestigious popularity and strive to further development of the college quality-wise. The college library is having 5000 books with free Wi-Fi. The college has one unit each of NSS and Red-cross society which confirms the commitment of the college towards social service. Sports department of the college always ensures enough space in the media. In sports, the students of the college prove themselves at District level.

The college has carrierguidance cell and active women empowerment cell. Socio-cultural events are also organized at regular intervals. The college aims to make its student well equipped to face all round global change. The college is committed towards the educational development of the girl students too.

#### **Curricular Aspects**

Govt. Naveen College Pali, Korba (C.G.) is government college and functions under the higher education of Chhattisgarh and is affiliated to Atal Bihari Vajpayee University, Bilaspur (C.G.). The College offers three under-graduate courses in arts, science, commerce and two post-graduate courses, which include M.com. and M.A. Sociology. The curriculum is strengthened and supplemented by Atal Bihari Vajpayee University, Bilaspur and the college has limited flexibility in the development of the curriculum. However, each department of the college is responsible for the effective implementation of the prescribed curriculum. Academic calendar is prepared and implemented as per the guidelines of the university. The college has a defined vision and mission that is clearly spelled out to the students in the college website, our college also has active units of NSS and Red-Cross society. The college collects feedback from students and parents time to time. The feedback taken is analyzed and implemented by the faculty members which improves the teaching-learning process.

#### **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

The college follows a very transparent student admission process on-line. All the important information related to admission is provided in the admission-brochure and displayed on the notice board and the college website. Admission in the college at UG and PG level is done on merit basis as per state government and the university norms. The reservation policy of the government for SC/ST/OBC/physically challenged/Ex-army/ Achievers in sports without any gender discrimination and weightage for the extracurricular activities is followed strictly. During the academic year 2019-20, 498 students have been admitted. The college follows an academic calendar which has the examination schedule, vacation breaks and dates of important extra-curricular activities declared by the Higher education department of Chhattisgarh state. The teachers of the college are encouraged and expected to follow the Academic calendar. Teaching plans, syllabus and evaluation process are explained to the student class-wise by the faculty members. The faculty members take classes properly as per central time-table and maintain a daily- diary and attendance register. The college is aiming at improving the quality of the teaching-learning process by proper use of ICT. The library and internet facility emphasize "student-centric" system which helps students to think, analyze, be creative and unique. Certain steps are taken to address the needs of individuals. Not only the students but also the college ensures the competence of the staff, help and motivate the faculty to develop continuously. All the faculty members participate in workshops, present papers in conferences and some faculty have published the paper in UGC approved / Peer reviewed journals. Some of our faculties have published Book also. About 90% faculty member has completed refresher and orientation programs. The college has an internal examination committee which organizes the internal unit test, preexamination evaluation process through a system of efficient planning making it strict confidentially. The college has provided necessary infrastructure like a desktop, computer in the Library with free Wi-Fi access to help the student for learning.

#### Research, Innovations and Extension

Our institution is constantly striving for the development of research culture and research environment. Students are encouraged to incorporate research culture and data analysis in their class assignments and project works. The laboratories of the science stream have been upgraded. One faculty member recognized as Guide by Atal Bihari Vajpayee University, Bilaspur to carry research work leading to Ph.D. degree. Six faculty members are enrolled as research scholars in various universities for obtaining Ph.D. There are several research papers which are included in the UGC website in the recommended journals and published in Peer Reviewed and

Refereed journals. Published books havetwo books/chapters in the books. The institute is promoting the participation of students and faculties in extension activities every year by organizing campsin the village. Cadets of NSS and Red Cross participate in the extension activity with the governmental and non-governmentalorganization such as Swachh Bharat, Aids Awareness and gender issue, etc. The NSS unit engages students in community development activities. That motivate them to involve in social services. NSS day celebrations, NSS orientation, awareness rally, tree plantation, health awareness camp, culture programs, etc., are organized under NSS unit.

To increase the percentage of voting, a workshop based on the role of youth is organized by SVEEP. This includes various competitions such as extempore, debates, essay writing, sloganwriting, poster exhibition, rangoli, etc. An educational tour was organized for the students to impartpractical knowledge in particular. The college has internet facilities for faculty and students, well-equipped laboratories, well-stocked library and smart room toinspire and facilitate teaching, learning and research. The college organizes a workshop especially for students, inviting subject matter experts from various institutes, whoencourage and inspire students through their lectures.

#### **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

As a Government college, it has a big building of double stories under a large campus of 5acre. The existing physical built up area of the college is about 314.36 sqft and the college building is used from 10.30 am to 5.30pm There is a building maintenance committee, the committee seeks departmental requirements, needs of laboratories, classroom, library and sports etc. and send the proposal with details of budget requirements to the department of higher education, government of Chhattisgarh for approval. The College administration formulates a sports committee to monitor the sports activity. Class four employees are also involved to assist in the sports activities. There is a very healthy atmosphere for games/sports and cultural activities in the college. Many students have represented the college at district and state level. The college has well laid out facilities for indoor and outdoor sports. The college has been conducting the following tournament for encouraging sports talent among the students. The college encourages the students to participate in the special coaching classes during vacationand the outdoor auditorium is also used to conduct various cultural activities. College cultural fest, sports day, athletic meet, yoga training and such activities are organized.

- Over and above the academic support facilities like the library, the sports and the other platform supporting overall development to the student like NSS, Red cross society etc.
- A library is very well maintained. A provision of the budget for library maintenance is made by the college management. The cleaning and maintenance of the library and keeping it insects free are done frequently by the library staff.
- The college administration formulates committees for physical maintenances and verification. Annual internal audit is taken up by such committees. For smooth functioning of the institution under the guidance of the head of the institution, various committees have been formed to look after the various academic, cultural and literary activities.

#### **Student Support and Progression**

The various cells and Committee like Anti-Ragging Committee, Anti-sexual Harassment Committee, Career

Counseling cell, Women's Cell and Student Union etc. function in the college to provide necessary assistance to the student for their overall well bring. There is a Grievance Redressal cell to clear the grievances raised by the students. Examination result and high demand ratio of the college are proof of the student support system. The website and college brochure provide all necessary imported information regarding admission and the activities in the campus. The government reservation policies are followed to provide support to the SC, ST, OBC and thestudents with an economically weak background. Cultural events are a part of the varied activities; thus, students are involved in and they are able to perform well. The college also fulfills its responsibilities towards the society through Red Cross, NSS. 'IQAC'.Lectures organized on the judicial rights of women against exploitation at home, outside, workplace and rehabilitation of juvenile criminal cases. The NSS wing of the college engages the students in community development activities which motivate them to involve in social services. The college NSS team regularly visits the surrounding places and villages to generate awareness among people on various social, moral and ethical issues. Feedback is taken from the students, teachers and alumni on the Infrastructure and Academi facilities, and feedback is analyzed and remedial actions are implemented.

### Governance, Leadership and Management

The vision of the college is to serve and provide education equally to all the students. The majority of the students enrolled in this college belong to the scheduled caste, scheduled tribe and OBC coming from the rural background and falls below the poverty line. The vision of the college is to give not only bookish knowledge but to inculcate good manners, self - respect, politeness, consciousness, good physical and mental health. We are also focused on national standards of education quality and fostering an enduring sense of discipline. In our college, each activity takes place through the meeting of the respective committee. The teachers and the staff have been involved in the process of decision making and its implementation. To address the demand of the society and provide greater exposure to the students, field trips / study tours are organized. The teachers 'recruitment is done as per the norms of the UGC, state government and the university. Each and every staff is performing very well. The principal and the management hold the regular staff meeting and address them about their responsibility for the college. Various committees are formed with the teaching and non - teaching staff and student to groom their scale they are explained aboutadmission, teaching & learning. The college gives utmost importance to the teaching- learning process and its improvement. The faculty membersare also involved in various committee and activities of the college. They are encouraged to attend seminar/conferences &workshops and presentation of paper. The accounts of our collage Pali is regularly audited – internally and externally. Internal audits are done by a team of faculty members appointed by the college whereas the external audit is done by a firm of professional chartered accountants. The college is recognized u/s 2(f), but not recognized u/s 12 (B), as the affiliating university is not covered u/s 12 (B) of UGC act 1956. The IQAC plays an important role relating to quality improvement amongst student and teacher and always motivates to update teaching learning process. We have to motivate teacher for participation in state, national and international seminar, workshop and other research activities.

### **Institutional Values and Best Practices**

The institution is an organization which respects values and implant these values in the students by the faculties to run it smoothly. It also tries to establish an example as the best institute of this area. The college is the only government college in this tribal area and co-educational college also. So, the college takes proper care of the

safety and security in and around the college for both girl and boy students. These are maintained by 16 CCTV surveillance system, guard and fencing in the college. It ensures discipline in the college building and campus with the help of various committee. It effectively implements the code of conduct mentioned in the brochure of the college like anti-ragging and following time-table

and discipline. The counseling cell of the college gives regular counseling to the needy students both boys and girls, time to time. This helps them to cope up with the crucial conditions and strengthen them during crises. Women empowerment is also one of the main aims of the institution. So, a few programs are organized to spread the message of gender equality amongst the students. Series of lectures by invited guests and eminent speakers, are organized to empower the girl students. Infrastructure is developed to make the college environment friendly for girls, boys and Divvyang Jan. Well-equipped commons rooms are provided separately for both boys and girls. Separate toilets are there in the college for boys and girls. Electricity conservation is one aims of the college. College committee looks after thecleanliness and waste management. The college has a proper rainwater-harvesting system, sewage system and water pipe-line system for water distribution. The institute has its own borewell and it does green and energy audit and promote greenery and develop ecofriendly environment in and around, and is keen to keep the campus plastic free. The institution situated in tribal area organizes various programs to promote localculture, national language- Hindi and digitalization. Speeches of eminent speakers are arranged in the college. The two best practices practiced in the college are preparation of 'Wormy compost' out of garbage and 'Daily prayer through National Anthem' by the students.

### **Response:**

Govt. Naveen College Pali, district Korba is affiliated with Bilaspur University which is also known as Atal Bihari Vajpayee University, Bilaspur Chhattisgarh. The college follows strictly the curriculum laid by University. The syllabus is provided to all teachers for the effective implementation of the curriculum. Development of action plans are done in the following ways:

- 1. In the college broacher and website information related to the curriculum, like different courses, fee structure, admission process, etc are given in details.
- 2. The teachers make lesson/unit wise teaching plan for each class, and mentain daily diary for assuring the plan implementation.
- 3.Besides the Unit test, quarterly and models test per exam are organized as per the academic calendar by the college.
- 4. The teacher follows different innovative and effective teaching-learning techniques.
- 5 .Library facility to staff and students which is equipped with subject books, reference books and newspapers.
- 6. The library have near about 5500 books and subscription of 2 newspapers.
- 7. The syllabus guidelines and previous year university question paper are also made available to the students.

Best Practice - I

1. Title of the Practice: Wormy Compost & its Utility

#### 2. Objective of the Practice :-

The Government Naveen college, Pali is situated outside the township in a natural environment. Inside and outside the college campus enough plantations are done. So the wastages of tree leaves are used to make wormy compost in the college. This helps to keep the college campus clean. The manure made out of proper waste management is used for giving in the plants & trees planted in the institute. In the campus many seasonal and decorative plants are planted. So the manure prepared by the leaves are used for their growth. This use of compost reduces ill effects of chemical fertilizers.

#### 3.The Context:-

The use of chemical fertilizer without proper knowledge and Quantity damage the plants of various kinds like seasonal plants & decorative plants put adverse effects on their growth. Either the plants die or become unhealthy. So the use of wormy compost reduces such adverse effects and the plants and trees become healthy. This enhances the power of holding moisture in the soil and become porous. This in turn helps plants healthy growth.

#### 4. The Practice :-

The college building is out of the sphere of Nagar Panchayat. So there was one problem in fronts of the college to manage the waste . so to find out the solution in the crisis, the college administration decided to make proper use of the green waste to prepare wormy compost out of it. It proved to be a good start for the institution. For this purpose the empty space one tank is made. The green waste like leaves, cow dung & wormy powder etc. are put in this tank. Regularly water is sprinkled over it

.This helps to prepare the moisture in it. About after 2 months these wastes are converted into vermin compost. This compost in full of nitrogen, phosphorus and potash naturally. This is used to make the college campus green and clean. This again reduced the bad effects of use of chemical fertilizer.

#### 05. Evidence of Success:-

Various types of plants planted in college require nutrients to maintain good growth and greeneries. And to avoid the side effects caused by the use of chemical fertilizers, wormy compost is used. Due to which there is no lack of nutrients in the plants. As a result, the plant remains permanent and covered with flowers. This not only helps in keeping the environment clean, but by staying in their midst, the mind becomes happy and cheerful and it also increases the work efficiency.

#### 06.Problems Encountered and Resources Required: -

Initially, many obstacles and problems arose to perform these tasks. What to do it and where to build the Tank, what are the methods to maintain humidity in it, etc.? Eventually, the work was started with determination, the result of which is visible to all.

#### **Best Practice II**

**1.Title:-** Daily Prayer by singing National Anthem in the college.

#### 2. Objectives of the Practice: -

The college starts with a prayer of national anthem daily. The main purpose of this practice of starting classes and office work after singing National Anthem as prayer—is to inculcate discipline and develop responsibilities towards the nation. The youth batch of college students (both girls and boys) are the future citizens of our nation. So, by respecting National Anthem naturally they will learn to love their country. They will be motivated to perform their duties towards the nation. They will be concerned about the growth of the nation. So, they will be inclined towards new innovations and new ideas. To avail overall personality development and skill development of the students from weak background, they are motivated to participate in the programs like-quiz, debates, extempore, essay writing, sports and cultural activities organized in the college. The students are inspired to use library and read some books; novels other than their course books. The institute maintains proper disciplines in and around the campus. The discipline committee is responsible for it.

The institution aims at engendering values, character traits, exposure and honesty in the students. So that at the end of the day they become good human being and good citizen. Faculty member are also inspired to develop their skills and research ability on priority basis. The college is always ready to collaborate with the nearby villages through the unit of NSS, Red Cross and others. By organizing rally, 'Nukkad Natak', and cultural programs, this aim is attained. The villagers also get aware about various matters like- minimum age of marriage for boys and girls, importance of voting, education, nutritious food for women and children and health and cleanliness. Preparation of 'Wormy Compost' out of green garbage management and one disciplinary activity performed by the college by daily prayer are the unique work performed by the college.

### **Concluding Remarks:**

During the journey of eight years since 2013, the institution has left no stone unturned to excel in all the seven criteria of development. It tried to fulfill its vision, sort out its weaknesses, find out the opportunities and meet the challenges. So, the improvement is practically seen day by day with the growing strength of its student enrolment. The hard work of faculty members is shown in securing the best position in Arts faculty result of annual examination in Atal Bihari Vajpayee University, Bilaspur. New courses are also introduced in the Post graduate level as MA Sociology and M.Com. The institute has enhanced its infrastructure. It has developed system of safety and security inside the building and campus by implanting CCTV surveillance, boundary wall and guard.
